SCOPE: *The purpose of this course is to examine the interaction between the "politics and economics", "power and wealth" and "political authority (states) and markets" at both the national and international level. Besides, the evolution of international political and economic relations since the emergence of the modern state system in the mercantilist period will be analysed in a historical perspective. The course is intended to give students background on the interaction between economics, economic history, politics, international history and international relations. In this context, the theories and history of international political economy will be discussed with an emphasis on the significant issues in the twentieth and early twenty-first century.*

COURSE CONTENT: *In the lectures and seminars, main approaches and theories of international political economy, such as PIER School, New IPE School, Global Political Economy School will be analysed and discussed. In this context, political impact on the operation of the global, regional, international and national markets and the opportunities provided and limitations imposed on the political, military security, autonomy and sovereignty issues by the market will be analysed. The analysis will focus on the interaction and the relationship between state and market, power and wealth, production, growth, development, distribution of wealth, intergovernmental organisations, multinational corporations and also on the meaning of the phenomena of "globalisation", "regionalisation" and proliferation of ethnic, religious, civil society non-state actors and anti-state movements in the early 21st century.*

TEACHING ARRANGEMENTS: *The students are expected to write and present papers for discussion. Those who with little or no background in international economics are strongly advised to attend the BSc lecture course, IR235 Introduction to International Political Economy.*
